Can you put a lock on an electrical panel?

Don't place any lock on the door to your electrical panel or the room housing the electrical panel. If you have an outdoor electrical panel, ensure it's free of snow and debris. Make sure everyone in the home knows the location of your electrical box.

Where should a breaker box be placed?

Wherever you may want to place your circuit box, you must follow the electrical panel mounting requirements dictated by the NEC (National Electrical Code). For the sake of brevity, The National Electrical Code outlines that a breaker box must be installed in an area that provides clearance around the electrical panel.

Can you put electrical panels behind a locked door?

A non-code issue is: Best not to put panels behind locked interior doors. Someone may see an emerging electrical fire, and stop it immediately by shutting off the breaker NOW. People can self-help with routine trips - for instance whoops, the break-room toaster and microwave shouldn't be run together.

Where should a circuit box be placed?

Perhaps you want to put it somewhere inconspicuous - in a closet or in the bathroom. Whatever the reason is, you must first be aware that there are electrical panel location rules. Wherever you may want to place your circuit box, you must follow the electrical panel mounting requirements dictated by the NEC (National Electrical Code).

The National Electrical Code explicitly prohibits the installation of overcurrent devices, like circuit breakers, in clothes closets. This prohibition stems from the high fire risk associated with ...
