While Poland has neutralised the immediate threat of Russian energy coercion, full energy independence remains a work in progress. The country still needs to further reduce fossil fuel imports in favor of renewable energy. Encouragingly, Warsaw has made notable progress on this front.

Does Poland's energy transition really work?

Poland's energy transition is gaining momentum, and although it still lacks coherent and strategic policy documents to guide it, there are now tangible results: in 2024, coal's share in electricity production fell to a record low of 56.2%.

How much energy does Poland use?

In just the past year, coal consumption has dropped by 14%. However, the structure of primary energy consumption in Poland remains heavily dependent on fossil fuels, which still account for as much as 85% of total energy use, including 41% from coal, 27% from oil, and 17% from natural gas.
